Dear Industry Colleague:

Do you know someone in the industry that has done something selfless and extraordinary for the benefit of others?

If so, you may wish to nominate that person for the prestigious Pride Award, sponsored and presented by the National Auto Body Council (NABC). Currently in its 15th year, the Pride Award embodies the NABC spirit and mission to improve the image of the collision repair industry. It allows the NABC to recognize those individuals or groups from the industry that selflessly contribute to the world around them. The award has been given for bravery, philanthropy, charity, and selfless acts of kindness. It transcends the rigors of daily business and reaches out to uncover those not seeking recognition for themselves.

Close to 50 deserving people have received the Pride Award over the past 14 years. Here is a handful:

- **Roger Cada**, who repairs cars in his spare time, is a senior claim education and training instructor for State Farm Insurance. He and wife, Sue, helped found Community Car-Care, a program through which vehicles are repaired free of charge for single parents who cannot otherwise afford maintenance.
- **Keystone Automotive** won the award for their continued generous contributions to many humanitarian needs. In addition to providing key support to help NABC build the medical center at Camp Mak-À-Dream, they designated \$140,000 to the Save the Children campaign for tsunami victims and have contributed to Collision Industry Relief.
- **The auto body students at Cerritos College in Cerritos, CA**, rebuilt a car for one of their own who is serving his country at the war in Iraq.
- **Jack Rozint**, working at the time for CCC Information Services in Chicago, IL, cooked breakfast every Friday for five years for 50 homeless people before going to work. He bought the food at his own expense, and helped find work and permanent shelter for some.
- **The Piña family** of Brea Auto Body in Brea, California, adopted an orphanage in Tecate, Mexico.

Take some time to remember the people you know, either in your own organization or elsewhere, that have taken action to make the world a better, safer place. Please "shine a light" on them by nominating them for a 2010 Pride Award.

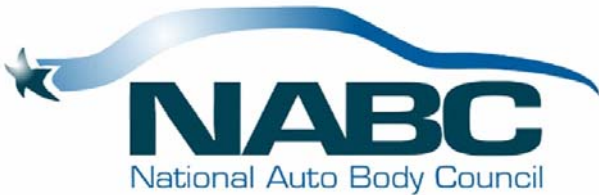
